WHAT IS THIS VIOLENCE THAT INHABITS US?

Violence, aggression and passage to the act could be the subject's response to an unbearable situation for him. For psychoanalysis, the response is always singular and it is correlative of an act that refers to the responsibility of the subject. The passage to the act is to enact one's violence instead of symbolizing it by means of speech. But can everything be said? There are indeed things that resist being said because they are made of something other than language. They are made of a substance that expresses itself better by gestures of transgression. What is transgressed are the limits of language. Violence can be the return in excess of jouissance, the fault of which inhabits the heart of being.

She edited the book “Agrafes et inventions dans la psychose ordinaire” [Staples and Inventions in Ordinary Psychosis]. She holds a DESS in clinical psychology and psychopathology from the University of Paris X.
