- **(1) ICLO-NLS CLINICAL CONVERSATIONS**

Guest psychoanalysts from abroad, members of the World Association of Psychoanalysis (WAP), join us four times a year to work on topics that are central to psychoanalytic clinical practice. The “Clinical Conversations” are organised with two points of emphasis: cases are presented for discussion, and theoretical concepts are studied and put to the test – thus following Lacan’s definition of psychoanalysis as being “the theorisation of a praxis”.

- **(2) ICLO-NLS TEACHING SEMINAR**

This open Seminar of ICLO-NLS held under the title, “Lacanian Psychoanalysis and the Clinic” is addressed primarily to anybody working in a clinical or applied setting with an interest in how psychoanalytic thinking may be helpful to him or her. Nine two-hours seminars will take place divided into three themes: “Working with Children”, “Working with Psychosis” and “Working with Addictions”. These seminars will focus on introducing and deepening participants’ psychoanalytical understanding of these topic areas as well as their clinical articulation (through vignettes and clinical examples) in terms of key analytic concepts such as transference, symptom and interpretation.

- **(3) ICLO-NLS OPEN SEMINAR**

For its second consecutive year, this Seminar will explore the complex conceptual, clinical and political relationships between Lacan’s work and the so-called Post-Freudians. “Lacan with the Post-Freudians” aims at recognising the legacy and value of a diversity of psychoanalysts while, at the same time, highlighting the impasses where something of the real proper to psychoanalysis is encountered. This year there is an invitation to critically re-read the works of Michael Balint, Melanie Klein and Donald Winnicott and to engage with the significance of their contributions to psychoanalysis in the 20th century.

- **(4) ICLO-NLS SEMINAR (Members only)**

ICLO-NLS’s Annual Member Seminar “Reading the ‘Ecrits’” aims at a rigorous work of reading, conceptual analysis and articulation of clinical and theoretical problems, with an emphasis on the transmission of psychoanalysis outside the university discourse. That is to say, it concerns the modalities through which the question of psychoanalytic formation, and psychoanalysis in intension, are approached and responded to within ICLO-NLS.
